Summary:

Yesterday and last night: All containment lines on the south, west and east are holding. Yesterday, isolated islands of vegetation burned, sometimes producing smoke visible from State Highway 60. The fire, overall, was less active than in previous days probably due to increased humidity.

Today: The fire is expected to continue its slow creep into the Superstition Wilderness. Crews, supported by a helicopter dropping water, are burning out vegetation in a draw northeast of Fortuna Peak. Some pockets of vegetation continue to burn north of the Queen Creek Tunnel but previous burnout operations to the east should contain the fire in this area. Containment lines on the west, south and most of the east are looking good. Crews are continuing to strengthen lines and monitor for hot spots. The suppression operation is downsizing today. Equipment and personnel are being released and made available for work on other fires.
