Dear Mr. Bosworth:

This is in response to your letter of September 6, 2017. Thank you for inviting the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) to become a participating agency on the environmental review of the Resolution Copper Project and Land Exchange Environmental Impact Statement. As a science organization, the USGS does not typically take part in endeavors such as this in order to maintain a non-advocacy position relative to the project and the independence of our science comments. Therefore, we respectfully decline the invitation.

However, the USGS as part of its mission may be able to provide science support if our data and scientific expertise have direct relevance to proposed actions under the National Environmental Policy Act review. USGS assistance could include attending or making presentations at scoping and technical meetings, conducting special studies, and data collection projects if funding were available.
